### Why study abroad?



- Less than 10% of US college students study abroad
- Shows college admissions and employers skills such as intercultural competence, diversity, problem solving, "thinking out of the box"...
- Personal skills you gain: independence, creativity, initiative, adaptability, a sense of humor, flexibility, values, patience...
- 85% of students agree that studying abroad was the most meaningful experience of their undergraduate education.

- 100% greater improvement in GPA post study abroad
- 97% of study abroad students found a job within 12 months of graduation vs.
   47% of college graduates found employment in the same period.
- 25% higher salaries: that's how much more study abroad students earn than those college graduates who did not study abroad. That averages around \$7000 per year
- 90% of study abroad alumni who applied got into their 1<sup>st</sup> or 2<sup>nd</sup> choice of grad schools.

- Extensive incident response and crisis management plan


### **Orientation & AIFS staff services**

- Half-day tour of Cape Town including entrance to the District Six museum


### **Student Services:**

- 24-hour emergency contact service for the duration of the program

- Twin, triple or quad-bedded rooms in a shared lodge or apartment
- Equipped kitchen, living area, full bath, laundry facilities on site
- Wi-Fi provided
- Located in the Observatory district of Cape Town.

- Group Lunch in Simons Town


### Stellenbosch

### Garden Route

- 3-day, 2-night excursion including round trip transportation by private minibus
- Accommodation in backpacker's dorms and luxury tents on half-board basis
- Game Drives and Bush Walks with professional rangers in Buffelsdrift and Botlierskop game reserves
- An educational program with GreenPop including service-learning
- Tour of Cango Caves



### Included in the program fee \$3740 (15 -19 students); \$3590 (20+ students)

- Community College tuition fees (CCPG "Promise" Grant- former BOG Fee Waiver) applicable)

## Eligibility requirements

- Applicant must be 18 years or older.
- Completion of at least 12 units of degree applicable college credit
- GPA of 2.5 or higher
- A grade of **C or better** in **English 100** completed by the Fall 2019 semester.
